It might seem like a lot of hot air, but incorporating air movement into a facility has numerous benefits that are often overlooked. Temperature and air quality, according to the Center for the Built Environment, directly affect productivity, and the narrow range of conditions at which people are most productive is largely dependent on adequate ventilation and air circulation. Air conditioners, although effective in most climates, are generally considered energy hogs. Evaporative coolers (effective in some climates), natural ventilation from operable windows, and the breeze from large diameter, low-speed fans are some popular alternatives or additions to the common practice of using traditional HVAC systems for comfort and maintaining good indoor air quality. Cafeterias, gymnasiums, libraries, and classrooms are designed to house more students and operate more intelligently than schools of the past, often serving a variety of activities. These multi-use facilities generally create higher occupancy densities and a greater need for air circulation. From a ventilation standpoint, a well-mixed space by use of large diameter fans assures that all ventilation is able to reach the occupants before being exhausted out of the building. 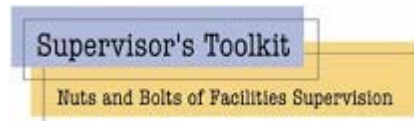

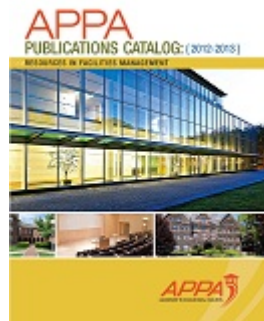

Solar Array to Save Muskingum University on Utility Costs

Muskingum University has constructed a 75-kilowatt, 297 panel solar array atop its recreation center. The array is expected to save about \$15,000 annually in electricity costs. The project was paid for through university capital improvements funds. Muskingum is looking at two or three more small projects—solar panels for the library and art gallery—that could lead to saving thousands of dollars in utility costs in the coming years. University of South Carolina Installs Solar Trash Compactors

The University of South Carolina facilities department has installed eight solar compactors and recycling units around the Russell House University Union. The units contain a trash compactor operated by solar power and a recycling unit. The new compactors replaced 40 trash cans from around the Russell House. This will have an impact on facilities workers' labor and the appearance of the area around the union, and it also will increase access to recycling. With the old trash cans, the facilities department was unable to match a recycling unit with every trash bin. The new compactors provide parallel access. The units also offer five times the capacity, meaning workers won't have to empty the bins as often. Because the units are connected to the Internet, workers will be alerted when the bins are filling and need to be emptied. This will allow the workers to complete other landscaping projects around campus rather than spending so much time emptying the trash bins. [Learn more.](#)



Electric Vehicle Chargers Installed at Moraine Valley Community College

Moraine Valley Community College in Palos Hills, IL, is ready to aid the growing number of electric vehicle owners after installing two charging stations on campus last month. Anyone who has an electric vehicle can now charge it at newly installed stations. Users can park and hook up to the charger as long as they are registered, and can open an account and pay as little as \$1 per hour to charge a vehicle. The company that deployed the charging systems is a leader in the research and development of advanced energy systems particularly alternative fuel, and received a grant from the U.S. Department of Energy to do this work. It's part of the Electric Vehicle Project, which is setting up thousands of chargers in 21 cities and metropolitan areas in nine states. [Learn more.](#)
