10 Workplace Trends For 2015

Prepare for the new year with this preview of 10 Workplace Trends For 2015. In this analysis, a <u>Forbes</u> magazine writer summarizes the most significant trends from the hundreds of studies released by his company and third parties throughout the year. All of the factors listed have created a system where everyone is always under pressure to stay relevant, choose degrees that turn into jobs and constantly reinvent themselves. Here

are the predictions:

- 1. Companies hiring Generation Z for internships. Gen Z's were born between 1994 and 2010, the oldest among them will be a senior in college in 2015.
- **2** . More millennials are taking leadership roles. In 2015 millennials become the largest percentage of the workforce for the very first time.
- **3** . Honesty becomes a revered leadership trait. In a recent study, *Forbes* found that 52% of Gen Zs and Gen Ys state that honesty is the most important quality for being a good leader.
- **4.** The skills gap continues to widen. The Bureau of Labor Statistics shows that there were 4.7 million job openings in June and more than half of employers say that they can't find qualified candidates.
- **5.** The continuous job search picks up. 86% of employees are already looking for work outside their current occupations and nearly one third of employers expert workers to job hop.
- **6** . Mobile hiring and the mobile job search explode. 83% of job seekers currently use smartphones to search for job openings yet only 20% of the Fortune 500 companies have a mobile friendly career site.
- **7.** Social media posts used to attract and retain talent. 58% of people are more likely to want to work at a company if they are using social media and over 20% are more likely to stay at their companies if they are using social media.
- **8.** Succession planning becomes a top priority. Succession planning is going to be a major concern for companies starting next year as more boomers start to retire.
- **9.** Women continue to seize power positions in the workplace. A study by Pew Research shows that millennial women are now earning 93 cents for every dollar earned by men.
- **10.** More people stepping out of traditional career paths. A recent study by Elance-oDesk shows that 53 million Americans are now freelancers, which is 34% of the American workforce.

The Virginia Society of the American Institute of Architects has honored Virginians who have made creating, preserving and enhancing Virginia's communities a life commitment and a museum with a building that has

withstood the test of time by presenting them with 2014 Honors awards. Among the awards, The College of William and Mary's Muscarelle Museum of Art, designed by Carlton Abbott, FAIA, received the Society's Test of Time award. The building's most notable



feature is the ingenious trombe wall, which incorporates monumental tubes filled with colored water, which are changed several times a year. In addition to the wall being a work of art it also functions as a solar energy collection system. Learn more .

2014 Green Building Standard Now Available from ASHRAE/USGBC/IES

New requirements to further reduce energy and environmental impacts of buildings are contained in the 2014 version of the green building standard from ASHRAE, the U.S. Green Building Council and the Illuminating Engineering Society. ANSI/ASHRAE/USGBC/IES Standard 189.1-2014, Standard for the Design of High-Performance, Green Buildings Except Low-Rise Residential Buildings, addresses the areas of site sustainability; wateruse efficiency; energy efficiency; indoor environmental quality; and the building's impact on the atmosphere, materials, and resources. The 2014 standard incorporates 67 addenda, reflecting changes made through the public review process since the standard was last published in 2011. Appendix H gives brief descriptions and approval dates of the addenda included in this new edition. Learn more.
