APPA Launches New I-Codes Work Group

APPA's I-Codes Work Group, which is organized by the APPA Standards and Codes Council, held its Inaugural Convener's Meeting on September 30, 2014. The group's mission is to propose changes and suggest new language for the International Building Code and other "I-Codes" now under public review (and under the purview of the International Codes Council). At its meeting the I-Codes Work Group discussed:

- Identifying the compliance challenges facing educational institutions as they seek to implement the I-Codes slated for review in 2015.
- Where the Work Group should concentrate its time and resources, given the I-Codes up for review this coming year.
- Specific proposals the group may like to put on the floor at this time.

The Group is now moving forward to establish an active list of members, and is seeking diversity of institutions (four-year, two-year, public, private, etc.). Work Group meetings are being conducted monthly. Learn more. The I-Codes Work Group it targeting to hold it next meeting the first week of November.

A recently completed Collaborative Life Sciences Building in Portland has been certified LEED Platinum by the U.S. Green Building Council. The building is a next-generation health and science education and research facility that uniquely combines the resources and brainpower of three nationally respected universities under one roof: Portland State University, Oregon Health Sciences University, and Oregon State University. The building's design features suspended walkways, copious natural light, and
