Powerful Plenary: Be Facilities Ready

APPA's general session opened the conference with a heartfelt and sobering session where three survivors of "active shooter" incidents shared their personal stories:

- Kristina Anderson, survivor of the Virginia Tech shooting, and founder of the Koshka Foundation for Safe Schools;
- **Natalie Hammond**, former lead teacher at Sandy Hook Elementary School; and
- Frank DeAngelis, retired principal of Columbine High School.

In addition to sharing their personal experiences, all three panelists discussed efforts that facilities managers should take to ensure the facilities are as secure as possible and that they are actively engaged with public safety officials. The session encouraged the audience to empower their front-line workers to fully

own a space and be proactive to things that seem out of the norm. Participants were charged to go back to their campuses and ensure that all lines of communication are open and partnerships are developed with security and first responders. This includes making bu ilding schematics available. Now more than ever, everyone – students, faculty, custodial

Join Us in Congratulating America's Greenest Colleges and Universities

The Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) recognizes colleges and universities that have achieved the greatest level of success with green initiatives on campus and within in their surrounding

communities. AASHE gauges these efforts using the Sustainability Tracking, Assessment & Rating System (STARS), a voluntary system that allows different colleges and universities to report trends and track their sustainability efforts. This list from BestColleges.com names the 50 U.S. colleges and universities that have earned the highest STARS ratings, thereby distinguishing GREENEST COLLEGES themselves as the nation's greenest schools. Using these criteria, Colorado State University - 2015 was listed as the greenest higher-learning FRICO institution in the United States. Green Mountain College in Vermont placed second, and Colby College in Maine was third. View the full list here.

Research Reveals Universities Not Yet as International as They Think

Universities' internationalization rankings have limited significance, according to new research from the University of Warwick in the United Kingdom, which notes that the way internationalization is measured only takes into account the quantity of foreign students at each institution and not the extent to which they network with their counterparts from the UK. Thus, there is a strong emphasis on structural aspects of internationalization and less on social ones. The study

found that the higher the proportion of international students on campus, the less satisfied students of all nationalities rated their university experiences. It reveals that current internationalization benchmarking is only capturing a certain aspect of internationalization and, therefore, call for an agenda for social integration. The researchers explained: organizations, such as higher education institutions, which aim to internationalize are required to do so on multiple levels and in different stages



over time. This does not only include the development of an internationalization strategy and physically bringing students and staff together from different ends of the world, but requires a social integration agenda to fully grow into a socially viable organization. Avoid Counterfeit Electrical Products with Summer Safety Checklist

A major power management company has announced a summer safety checklist for educational institutions, aimed at helping electrical professionals maintain a safe environment by avoiding counterfeit electrical products. The checklist provides guidelines for educational facility professionals, including what to look for and what actions to take to protect the property, students, and staff from the serious health and safety risks counterfeit electrical products pose during the school year. According to a report from the United States Fire Administration (USFA), an estimated 25 percent of all non-confined school building fires occur because of an electrical malfunction. Key points from the checklist:

- Examine your products: When purchasing an electronic product, check for certification marks from organizations that certify the quality and performance of electrical products.
- Buy authentic: When buying new equipment for an educational facility, the best way to avoid purchasing a counterfeit product is to buy directly from the manufacturer or an authorized distributor.
- Avoid "bargains": Avoid prices that are substantially lower than the manufacturer's price.
- Evaluate the condition of your products: Evaluate the condition of any new product and its packaging immediately upon delivery. Any product that appears to have been tampered with, is missing information, or is noticeably poorly made should raise a red flag.
- Report your counterfeits: If you have questions about the authenticity of

your product, reach out to the manufacturer with your concerns.
