APPA Submits Opposition Statements on ICC Code Changes

The APPA Standards and Codes Council (ASCC) and International Code Council (ICC) Work Group released position statements reseveral proposed code changes for the 2018 editions of the International Fire Code, portions of the International Building Code, and International Energy Conservation Code (http://www.appa.org/standards_icodes.cfm).

APPA has sent the membership a Standards and Code Alert asking for your support in submitting comments on five ICC decisions the Louisville, Kentucky committee meetings in April.

Originally, the Work Group voted to recommend that APPA support 9 and oppose 17 recommendations, with the remainder as "no c After the ASCC annual meeting, Technical Action Hearings, and a Work Group meeting, the decision was to oppose three of the prc changes that the Technical Committee had approved and not to challenge any of the proposals that the Work Group supported but t committee disapproved.

The National Fire Sprinkler Association succeeded in overruling the committee on at least two proposals, potentially restoring them proposed 2018 edition.





Have a voice in the picture of facilities management statistics: The 2015–16 APPA/NACUBO Key Facilities Metric survey is now ope input through **December 12, 2016.** It is available online at www.appa.org/nacubosurvey16/. While some data can be considered bro benchmarking purposes, APPA members are urged to reflect upon their own numbers and evaluate for improvement every year.

The 2014–15 APPA/NACUBO Key Facilities Metric survey presents input from 279 colleges and universities of all types and regions increase of 16% in respondents from the first year of the survey. Let's move that percentage up for the new year!



The survey provides information about basic facilities data to improve strategic planning, such as BTU, electrical and water consum as waste output and carbon footprint, that is critical for leadership to know. Results reflect these five key (and simple) elements that from vendor or utility bills.

Green Roofs Deliver Sustainability, Stewardship at K-12 Schools

Several schools are working with LiveRoof Global LLC to install green roofs that set examples of environmental stewardship.

- A 15,000-square-foot LiveRoof® green roof on the Korematsu Middle School reduces the school's environmental footprint and energy costs, provides a living m sustainability best practices, and improves air quality.

Georgia Southern Installs Synthetic Turf in Football Stadium

Georgia Southern University will kick off its 2016 football season on synthetic turf, thanks to a study conducted with Woolpert also designed the instaprovided construction administration.



Benefits included addressing stadium drainage issues and cutting transportation costs – to protect the stadium's grass field, the team was bused elsewhere for practices.

Georgia Southern will host Savannah State University on Sept. 3 in the Eagles' season-opener.

Installing 15,000+ Solar Panels Reduces Emissions, Cuts Electricity Costs, Creates Learning Opportunities at UMAmherst

The University of Massachusetts Amherst has embarked on a major solar energy initiative that will cut its electric bills by \$6.2 million over 20 years and reduce emissions by the equivalent of 31,000 non-metric tons of carbon dioxide.

At no upfront cost to itself, the university is installing 15,576 photovoltaic panels across campus to provide 5.5 megawatts (MW DC) of clean renewable electric heavily discounted rates. The installations will be completed by the end of 2016.

Brightergy will engineer and construct the eight solar panels – six on rooftops and two above existing asphalt parking lots – and arranged for project finance, owr ongoing maintenance of the installations with ConEdison Solutions for up to 20 years through its partnership with Sol Systems. The university will buy all of the the \$16 million project for direct use on campus through a power purchasing agreement.

"UMass Amherst prides itself on being a sustainability leader, serving as a model for campuses and communities across the country," said Shane Conklin, asso chancellor for facilities and campus services. "We are very excited to be moving forward with what we view as an economic, environmental, and educational wir community."

The partnership provides presentations and career mentoring by Brightergy; student access to the Mullins Center parking lot solar array as a learning lab; \$41,00 funds for UMass Amherst students over the first three years; and internship opportunities for four students over the next three years.
