

APPA/NACUBO Key Facilities Metric Survey Results are in for 2014–15

New Survey Now Open for Your Input



The 2014–15 APPA/NACUBO Key Facilities Metric survey presents input from 279 colleges and universities of all types and regions – an increase of 16% in respondents from the first year of the survey.

The survey provides information about basic facilities data to improve strategic planning, such as BTU, electrical and water consumption, as well as waste output and carbon footprint, that is critical for leadership to know. Results reflect these five key (and simple) elements that readily come from vendor or utility bills.

The 2015–16 survey is now open and closes on **December 12, 2016.** It is available online at www.appa.org/nacubosurvey16/. While some data can be considered broadly for benchmarking purposes, APPA members are urged to reflect upon their own numbers and evaluate for improvement every year.



BCCB Program Receives ANSI Accreditation

The Certified Commissioning Professional (CCP) of the <u>Building Commissioning Certification Board</u> (BCCB) has been accredited by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), based on the International Standard ANSI/ISO/IEC 17024:2012, which sets the bar for how all certifications should be built. The BCCB was able to achieve the recognition through this version of the standard and by adopting the Job Task Analysis and Eligibility Requirements from the Commercial Workforce Credentialing Council, a council of the National Institute of Building Sciences.

The accreditation created the opportunity to apply for and receive recognition under the Better Buildings Workforce Guidelines program. The guidelines help federal agencies, and contractors serving them, implement the Federal Buildings Personnel Training Act and the Veterans Skills to Jobs Act.

With this accreditation, the CCP now meets the definition of certified commissioning professional in the new Washington State Energy Code. To find providers that meet this new code, go to http://bccbonline.org/ccp/registry/.

TIAA-CREF Creates Low-Carbon Retirement Fund

Facilities professionals who participate in TIAA-CREF and care about the environment have a new way to express that interest. In response to a request from a group of professors, TIAA-CREF has created the Low Carbon Social Choice Fund.

The fund meets environmental, social and governance criteria that are consistent with sustainability principles. It selects companies that (1) demonstrate leadership in managing and mitigating their current carbon emissions and (2) have limited exposure to oil, gas, and coal (fossil fuel) reserves – fossil fuel deposits that have not yet been extracted. Leadership criteria include a company's carbon emissions in both absolute (tons of carbon emitted directly into the atmosphere) and relative (tons of carbon emitted per unit of economic output such as sales) terms.

This approach can make a difference because university employees' retirement funds are typically even larger than university endowments. TIAA-CREF can provide a template for a letter asking HR directors to make this option available for investment.
