Rutgers Breaks Ground for New Sports Facility



Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, recently broke ground for the RWJBarnabas Health Athletic Performance Center, designed by Perkins Eastman. The 295,244-sf, four-story building will provide a

state-of-the-art practice facility for men's and women's basketball, wrestling, and gymnastics. It will be completed by June 2019.

This project is the first major initiative from Rutgers's 2015 Athletics Big 10 Build. It will include spaces for sports medicine, strength and conditioning, nutrition and training, and a sports performance lab to support the athletic program, along with a hall of fame, Spirit Shop, and training table. An integrated multi-story parking deck will provide hundreds of parking spaces.

"This pivotal project signifies an affirmation of Rutgers University's commitment to its athletics program and its student-athletes who represent Rutgers on a national stage," said David C. Schulz AIA, vice president of Planning, Development, and Design at Rutgers.

The center will be next to the Rutgers Athletics Complex (RAC) and Rutgers Business School.

Intelligent, Adaptive Building Systems Enhance Research Resource at U of Wisconsin

There is a new intelligent, adaptive building systems architecture at the Wisconsin Institutes for Discovery (WID) on the University of Wisconsin campus in Madison, designed ensure the facility will meet the needs of scientific research for the next 100 years.



Created by CBRE|ESI, a member of the InsidelQ Building Automation Alliance, the project integrated water reclamation, power usage, and lighting levels, fume hood controls and shades, among many other systems, and gives scientists ready access to information and energy consumption data so they can retrieve data across platforms, unlock islands of information, measure the impact of their actions within the facility, and manage consumption patterns.



Results reflect these five key (and simple) elements, which are easily accessible from vendor or utility bills.

The 2014–15 APPA/NACUBO Key Facilities Metric survey has a 16 percent increase in participation from the first year of the survey – input from 279 colleges and universities of all types and regions. Let's move that percentage up for the new edition!
