

New Northeastern Science Complex Uses Comprehensive Energy Strategies



Northeastem University's new 234,000-square-foot Interdisciplinary Science and Engineering Complex (ISEC), designed by Payette and implemented by Arup, used an integrated design process, advanced energy modeling software, and building information modeling (BIM) to create a high-performance, energy-efficient laboratory facility.

The Massachusetts Stretch Energy

Code calls for new buildings to perform 20% better than required by base code. The ISEC achieves 33% energy-cost savings over code and 75% energy savings compared to typical laboratory performance. Energy-conservation measures include:

- · A cascade air system
- · Performance and life-cycle analysis
- · Triple-glazed windows and a shading system
- · Active chilled beam technology and comfort-modeling software
- · A hydronic run-around coil system
- · A heat-recovery chiller
- · A passive solar collector

wood building in the northeastern
United States and one of the first
institutional buildings in the region to
employ an engineered timber
structure. Boston architectural firm
Leers Weinzapfel Associates
designed the building and Suffolk of
Boston managed construction.



Constructed with cross-laminated timber (CLT) and glue-laminated columns, the 87,000-square-foot facility saves the equivalent of more than 2,300 metric tons of carbon compared to a traditional energy-intensive steel and concrete building. The university's Building and Construction Technology program developed some of the CLT technology.



The interdisciplinary building has exposed structural elements and service systems for teaching, design research, and development.

Sustainable features include a roof garden supported by a long-span wood-steel "zipper" truss, LED lighting, motion sensors, daylighting, electro-tinting glass, heat-recovery systems, bioswales, rain gardens, low-flow faucets, and public transportation access.

The WoodWorks – Wood Products Council undertook a preliminary life-cycle assessment (LCA) and provided ongoing technical assistance and support.

Choose Your Own Cohort Group to Prepare for CEFP or EFP Exams



APPA members aiming to take the APPA Credentialing Course, a 90-day online course designed to help you prepare for either the CEFP or EFP examination with peers throughout APPA's six regions, now can select their cohort groups.

In the past, test-takers were placed in cohort groups when they registered for the course; when enough people registered, the course began. A table at the credentialing website has all of the cohort groups and the dates they will begin and end, along with the dates for taking the exams. When you register, you can select the cohort group that best fits your schedule. No more guessing when groups will begin or when you will have to take your exam.

APPA also offers the same course as a Fast Track, or express, version that is four weeks in length. The 90-day course and the Fast Track course offer the same Customized Interactive Learning Platform, which consists of a forum, interactive flashcards, learning modules with knowledge checks, four live webinars, practice exams and quizzes, and access to the Study Guide and Body of Knowledge (BOK). Those who complete the course will have 30 days to take their exams.

Two cohorts are currently open for registration: Group K begins on May 22 and Group L begins on June 16.

Number of U.S. Architects is Steady, Professional Mobility Increases

There are currently 109,748 architects in the USA, according to the 2016 Survey

of Architectural Registration Boards of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB) – a roughly 0.4 drop from 2015. Architects also increasingly hold licenses in multiple states nowadays, with 126,554 reciprocal (out-of-state) licenses, a 3% increase from 2015.

The pool of emerging professional architects working toward licensure also held steady in 2016; more than 41,400 candidates took the Architect Registration Examination® and/or reporting Architectural Experience Program™ hours.
