

International Panel on Climate Change Issues New Findings

On September 27, the International Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) issued <u>Climate Change</u> <u>2013: The Physical Science</u> <u>Basis</u> and an accompanying summary for policymakers. The assessment report points out that the "warming of the climate system in unequivocal... The atmosphere and ocean



have warmed, the amounts of snow and ice have diminished, sea level has risen, and the concentration of greenhouse gasses has increased." Find the full report at <u>Climate Change 2013</u>.

Novel New Higher Education Rankings System Tracks Public Investment and Media Engagement

Federal and state governments invest billions of dollars annually in research and scholarship at U.S. universities, but how good a job do those campuses do in sharing research findings and results with taxpayers through engagement with the public media? That question is the core of a new university ranking effort from the Center for a Public Anthropology at Hawai'i Pacific University. "The Faculty Media Impact Project" assesses how successfully the nation's top research universities engage lay media for coverage of their scholarly efforts in the social sciences. A few findings:

- Rice University and Southern Methodist University, both in Texas, ranked first and second, respectively, in the overall assessment, with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology coming in third.
- In individual disciplines, Washington University of St. Louis topped the Anthropology list, the University of Nevada-Reno came in first in Economics, and Yale led the Political Science

rankings.

• Oregon State University topped the Psychology listings, and Princeton led the Sociology rankings.

Four U Utah Buildings Earn LEED Gold

Three of the University of Utah's newly constructed buildings and one remodel have exceeded state and university sustainable building mandates:

• The Marriott Residential Scholars Community is recognized for its location, which is close to train

and bus stations, and for its ability to monitor energy use by floor.

 The Natural History Museum of Utah features photovoltaic panels contributing nearly 9 percent of the buildings' energy, water efficient landscaping, and pervious pavement in the parking lot.



- The Sorenson Molecular Biotechnology Building includes attention to energy use efficiency and local materials. (Pictured at right.)
- The University Data Center features high-efficiency server equipment with outside air recirculation to aid cooling efficiency.
