



USGBC Releases 2012 List of Top 10 States for LEED

The U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) has released its annual list of the top 10 states for new LEED certifications in 2012, highlighting those regions that are transforming buildings and communities across the country. The percapita list is based on 2010 U.S. Census data and includes commercial and institutional buildings certified under LEED, through which approximately 2.2 billion square-feet of space has been certified worldwide through 2012. Once again, the District of Columbia tops the ranking, with 36.97 square feet of LEED space certified per resident in 2012. Meanwhile, Virginia moved into the position as the top state, with 3.71 square feet certified per resident in 2012, overtaking Colorado, with 2.10 square feet certified per person. Other top states include Massachusetts, which moved up three positions from 2011, with 2.05 square feet per person; Illinois, with 1.94 square feet; and Maryland, with 1.90 square feet of LEED space certified per resident in 2012. GSA RFI on Green Building Certification Systems Review

In the February 5, Federal Register, the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) issued a request for information (RFI) calling for comments on their review of green building certification systems. Comments are due 60 days from that date. Section 436 of the Energy Independence and Security Act (EISA) of 2007 requires GSA to evaluate green building certification systems every five years to identify a system and certification level that "will be most likely to encourage a comprehensive and environmentally sound approach to the certification of green federal buildings." After GSA provides a recommendation to DOE, DOE works with GSA and DOD to identify a green building system(s) for federal buildings.
