Raising Red Flags: Three Warning Signs that Keep Your JOC Project from Being Audit-Worthy

The Job Order Contracting (JOC) process was originally intended to alleviate some of the administrative burden of the traditional design-bidbuild process, and return control to the owner. JOC is an indefinite delivery, indefinite quantity procurement method that enables facility

managers (FMs) to complete large numbers of routine, straightforward repair and renovation projects with a single, competitively bid contractl JOC is used by municipalities, schools and universities, state agencies, and



others for repairs, alterations, and in-kind replacement, and has been well-documented to expedite the construction procurement process. When properly managed, JOC has been found to save FMs between 8 to 15 percent compared to traditional bidding. However, improper forms of JOC have led to audits with negative results. <u>Raising Red Flags</u> examines warning signs to watch for in a JOC program to ensure a properly managed program. Military Facilities Reap Huge Benefits From Using LEED, Says Independent Study New research confirms LEED helps the government save taxpayer money and meet environmental objectives The U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) has released the findings of an independent report on energy efficiency and sustainability standards used by the Pentagon for military construction. The report from the National Research Council strongly affirmed the value of LEED-certified high-performing buildings to America's military and U.S. taxpayers. It noted that the DOD should continue to require that its new buildings or major facilities renovations be designed to achieve a LEED-Silver or equivalent rating, Based on a review of empirical studies related to energy-efficiency and green building standards, the report concludes that green building certification systems such as LEED offer frameworks for successfully reducing energy and water use in buildings. NCGBCS Releases Taxonomy of Building Codes and Standards

Calls for Public Comment

The National Institute of Building Sciences National Council of Governments on Building Codes and Standards (NCGBCS) is calling for public comment on the content of a new Code Taxonomy of building codes and standards. Code officials; codes and standards developers; federal, state, and local agencies; architects, engineers, and contractors; consumer advocates; and others are encouraged to provide input by the March 8 deadline. This compilation of codes and standards relating to the built environment is intended to serve as a resource when educating the industry, government, and the public about the regulations and referenced documents that are used when constructing buildings and facilities. While valuable on its own, the finalized taxonomy will be included on the <u>Whole Building Design Guide (WBDG)</u> in a new resource section entitled "Code Administration and Enforcement," which should be available later this year.
