A Study in Efficiency by Lochinvar Library boiler system upgrade helps Belmont University demonstrate its commitment to increasing environmental sustainability on campus.







# **Colby College Reduces GHG Emissions, Declares Carbon Neutrality**

Colby College in Waterville, ME has achieved what only a handful of

other higher education institutions have done so far: It has met its goal in the American College & University Presidents Climate Commitment and declared itself climate neutral. That means—essentially, with some caveats—that the college has zero greenhouse-gas emissions. The college is the largest institution to reach that goal to date. Climate neutrality was achieved through several initiatives including a switch to 100-percent renewable electricity, use of sustainably harvested wood biomass as its primary fuel for heat and hot water, increasing energy efficiency, lowering temperatures in buildings, and waste management initiatives. ### **EIA Launches Full Release of Annual Energy Outlook 2013**

On April 15, the U.S. Energy Information Administration (EIA) began the full release of Annual Energy Outlook 2013 (AEO2013), expanding on the AEO2013 Reference case highlights that were issued in December 2012. This release includes a Legislation and Regulations section that discusses evolving legislative and regulatory issues, a Market Trends section that highlights and summarizes selected aspects of the projections for energy markets, and a comparison of AEO2013 with projections from other organizations. The April 15 release will be followed by additional Issues in Focus articles on the dates indicated here:

- Oil price and production trends in AEO2013 (release on April 17, 2013)
- U.S. reliance on imported liquid fuels in alternative scenarios (release on April 17, 2013)

# Announcing the Second Annual Design-Build Student Competition; College Campus Residence Hall This Year's Focus

The Design-Build Institute of American (DBIA), through collaboration between the organization's 14 regions and national headquarters, will put students to the test with a unique competition that will provide hands-on experience in what DBIA calls "design-build done right." This year, teams

are asked to submit qualifications for a residence hall on a college campus in the United States. The residence hall will also house a Student Residential Academic Program (SRAC) and dining hall. The residence hall will be used during the summer months for various conferences and athletic summer camps. Last year, 27 teams responded to the initial Request for Qualifications (RFQ) issued in September, which focused on a hypothetical performing arts center on a college campus. The complete project scope and budget for this year's competition is being finalized and will be presented with the RFQ on September 23, 2013. This year's competition will take place in two phases, with an initial RFQ being issued to all registered teams on September 23. The three most qualified teams will be shortlisted. These teams will respond to the RFP with the winner selected during the Design-Build Conference and Expo being held Las Vegas, Nevada, November 4-6.
