The National Fire Prevention Association (NFPA) encourages parents and college safety and fire officials to remind students of basic steps they can take to ensure their safety, especially while living off campus.

It is crucial to have two ways out of a room. Fires can be unpredictable, so every student needs a backup plan in case the first route of escape is blocked. It is equally important to develop and practice an evacuation plan to ensure being prepared to act and feel comfortable with the plan. Make sure that there are working smoke alarms in each bedroom, outside every sleeping area, and on each level of the house to warn students and give them as much time as possible to exit the building in case of a fire.

Tallahassee Community College Teams with Siemens on Campus Infrastructure Improvements



Tallahassee Community College (TCC) has begun working with Siemens, an APPA Business Partner member, to address infrastructure improvement needs through a 15-year performance contract. TCC will use new building technologies and make capital improvements designed to reduce energy use and operational costs. Total projected savings include more than \$8.6 million in energy costs and nearly \$750,000 in operational costs.

Replacing two failed boilers on the TCC main campus with four high-efficiency boilers was the highest priority and was completed in January

of 2017. A new 500-ton chiller and one cooling tower will be installed, and two 750-ton chillers and another cooling tower will be refurbished by spring 2017. Lighting upgrades will be completed in buildings and parking lots. Work is expected to be completed by January 2018.

Rutgers-Camden Project Wins Award

The new Rutgers-Camden Nursing and Science Building in Camden, NJ, currently under construction, has been named a 2017 New Jersey's Leading Infrastructure Project by the New Jersey Alliance for Action.

PGMS Releases Guide to Best Practices



The Professional Grounds Management Society (PGMS) has released *A Guide to Grounds Management Best Practices* to its members. This guide will serve as a primary source of best practices in the green industry, including examples of specific practices and advice on how to implement them. The publication suggests and presents practices specific to the business of grounds management and shows examples of

how and where these practices are working for organizations striving to stay current with sustainability demands and those that realize the benefits to be gained from appropriately benchmarking grounds operations.

Initially, this extensive educational document will be available to PGMS members only through the PGMS website. The new PGMS guide will also be used by PGMS as part of its expanding <u>Landscape Management and Operations Accreditation program</u>.

CABA Completes 'Intelligent Buildings and the Impact of the Internet of Things' Research Project



The Internet of Things (IoT) is a conceptual framework driven by the idea of embedding connectivity and intelligence in a wide range of devices, according to the new "Intelligent Buildings and the Impact of the Internet of Things" research project from the Continental Automated Buildings Association (CABA). The report, a major initiative of the CABA Research Program, projects that there will be approximately 70 billion IoT-connected devices by the end of 2025 and that annual shipments will have reached 18 billion devices per year.

The CABA Intelligent Buildings Council, a core working council of CABA, commissioned the research project to examine the impact of IoT related to intelligent buildings. The report provides data relevant to all segments of the intelligent building value chain that building owners, technology manufacturers, builders and developers, integrators and installers, service providers, insurance companies, industry associations, and utility companies can act upon.

Preliminary Energy Savings Announced for ASHRAE/IES 2016 Energy Standard



More than 30 percent in energy savings can be achieved using the 2016 version of Standard 90.1, according to recent analysis conducted by Pacific Northwest National Laboratories (PNNL) in support of the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Building Energy Codes Program.

The recent 2017 ASHRAE Winter Conference featured an update on the preliminary results of the 90.1-2016 progress indicator report, ANSI/ASHRAE/IES Standard 90.1-2016, Energy Efficiency Standard for Buildings Except Low-Rise Residential Buildings, which was published in October 2016. The survey results are considered preliminary and are expected to be deemed final in October 2017 when DOE publishes its final determination.

PNNL's analysis shows that national aggregated site energy savings are 34.1 percent for whole building energy consumptions and energy cost savings are 34.2 percent, when compared to the 2004 standard.

On a nationally aggregated level, building-type energy savings average 48.6 percent for schools and energy-cost savings of 49.8 percent (schools). These figures include energy use and cost from the whole building energy consumptions, including plug and process loads.

The analysis incorporated 16 building prototypes modeled in 17 climate locations for a total of 272 building types in various climate zones. More than 120 addenda related to changes to requirements were used to calculate the energy reduction calculation.
