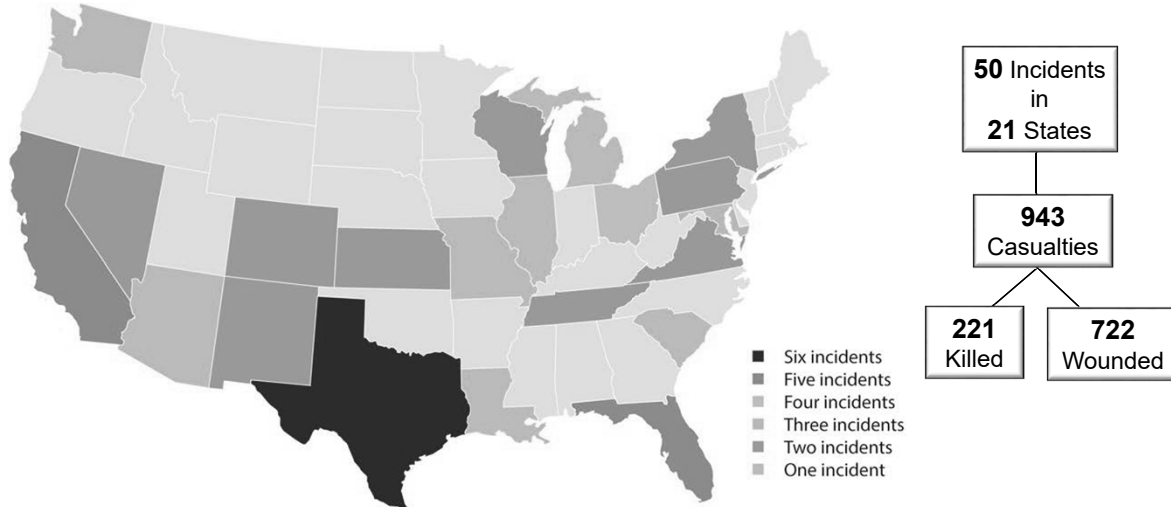

Active Shooter Incidents: 2016 & 2017

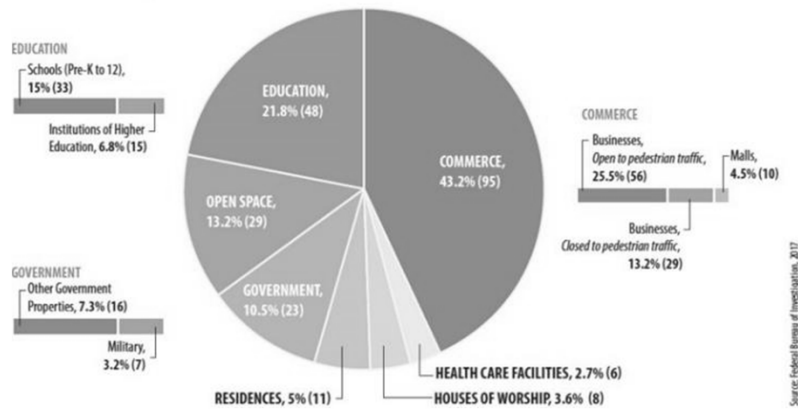

Incident Location Categories

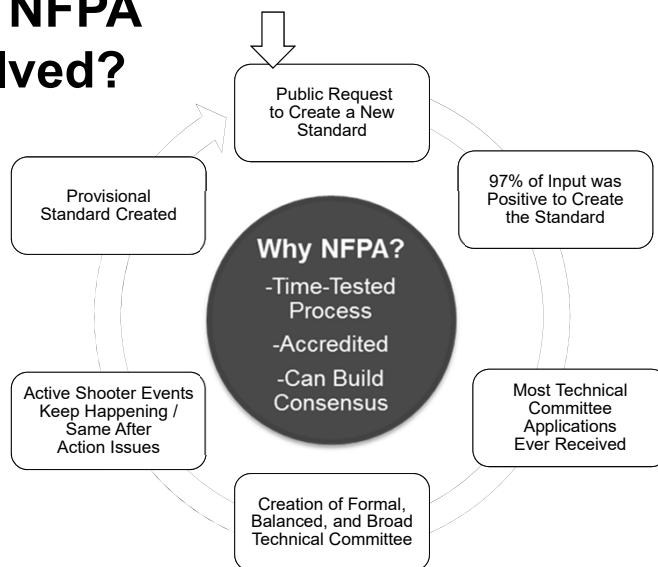
Quick Look: 220 Active Shooter Incidents in the United States Between 2000 - 2016

- APPA staff submitted comments on behalf of APPA that resulted in changes to Sections 9.5.1, 9.5.3, and 9.5.4.

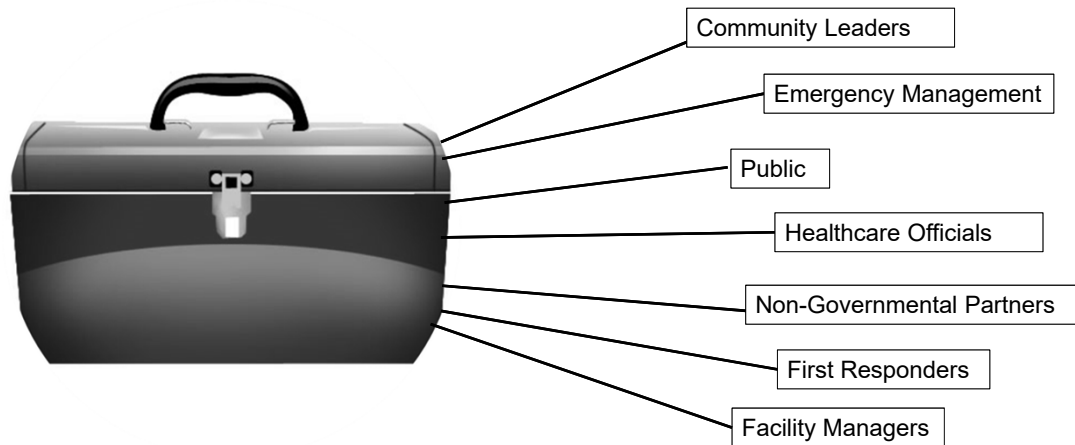

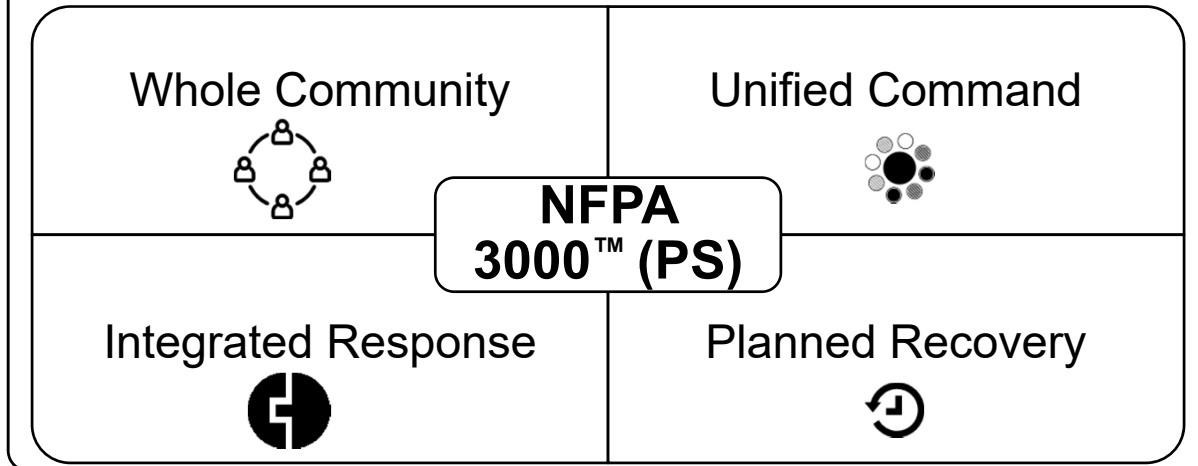

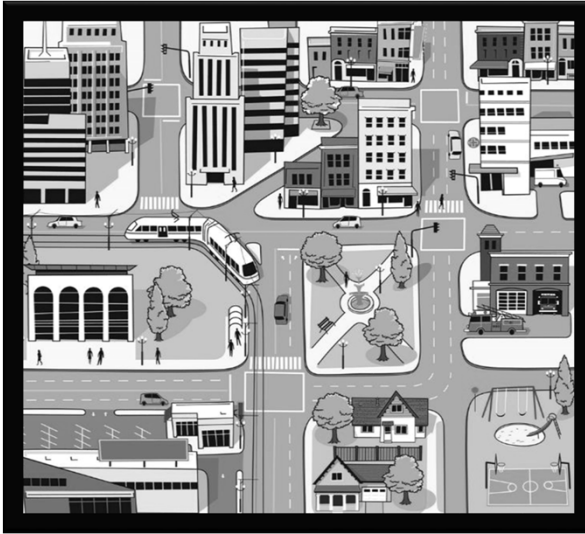

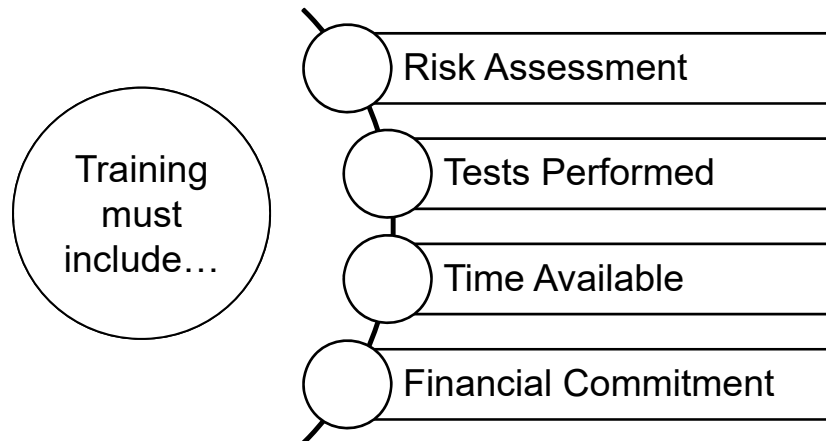

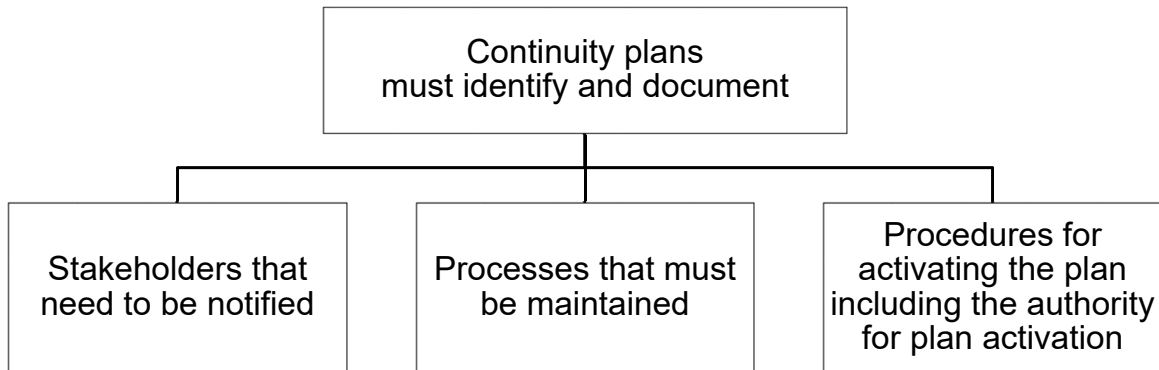

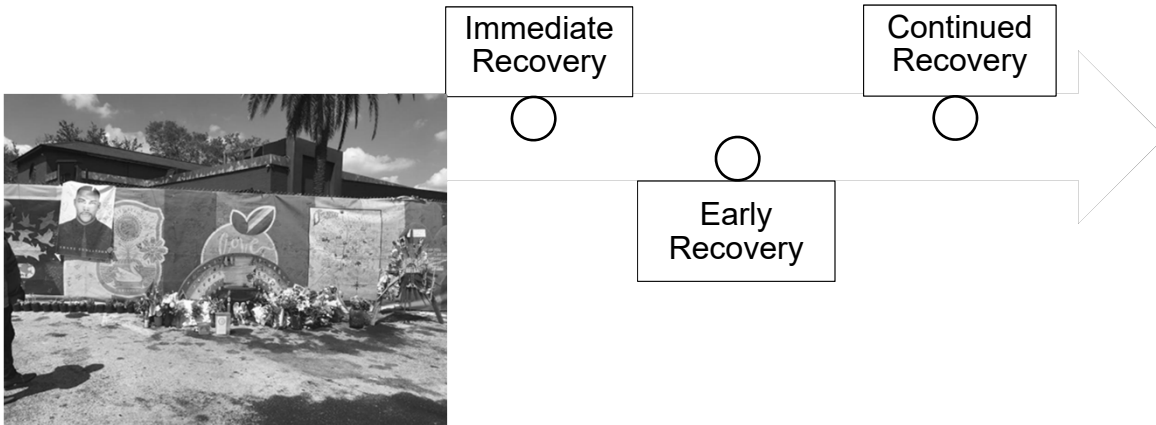
